North Miami**AfriCOBRA 50th Anniversary at MOCA**

AfriCOBRA, the pioneering black artist collective that originated in Chicago, is celebrating its 50th anniversary with a show at the Museum of Contemporary Art North Miami (MOCA). “AfriCOBRA: Messages to the People” features work from the movement's founding members—Jae Jarrell, Wadsworth Jarrell, Barbara Jones-Hogu and Gerald Williams—and five early members—Sherman Beck, Napoleon Jones-Henderson, Omar Lama, Carolyn Mims Lawrence and Nelson Stevens—created both in the early days of AfriCOBRA and more recently.
